

INFORMATION FOR OUR GUESTS AT PANIOLO HALE

*Aloha and E Komo Mai (Welcome) to Paniolo Hale
For a happy and safe stay, please read and follow the House Rules
For your convenience, a few highlights are noted below.*

REGISTRATION

As you are getting settled in your island home, please complete the registration process within 12 hours of your arrival. Registration forms and a drop box can be found in the Paniolo Hale office at Unit U-4. The Registration Packet is included here for your convenience. The Paniolo House Rules should be on file in your unit. If not, copies are available at the office.

RESIDENT MANAGER and ON-ISLAND HOST

Contact information for your On-Island HOST should be located in your unit and/or provided by the owner/rental agent. ***Your On-Island HOST is your primary contact*** for any questions regarding the unit, its appliances, keys, being locked out of the unit, or needed repairs.

The Paniolo Hale Resident Manager is John Pele. Mr. Pele should be contacted if an emergency occurs that is an immediate threat to the property, such as fire or an unstoppable water leak. His number is (808) 552-2631. Once a threat is under control, guests should contact the unit owner or their On-Island HOST to arrange any needed repairs.

THE POOL

THERE IS NO LIFEGUARD. SWIM AT YOUR OWN RISK. Children should never be at the pool unless they are accompanied by an adult. Hours of operation are posted at the pool as well as additional rules for the safe use of the pool. Please read and follow them.

PEACE AND QUIET

Quiet hours begin at 10:00 PM and end at 8:00 AM daily. Excessive noise is never allowed. With open lanais, sounds from within the unit and lanai can be easily heard outside the unit. Please close the lanai doors if you are watching TV or listening to music during quiet hours.

PETS

Pets are not permitted at Paniolo Hale unless you have prior approval to bring a service animal. If you intend to bring a service animal to Paniolo Hale, please contact the owner of your unit or the rental agent so that an application can be forwarded to you from the Resident Manager.

WATER

Water is very expensive on Molokai and we are subject to droughts here on the West end of the island. PLEASE conserve water whenever possible.

PARKING

Please park only in marked stalls and never on the grass.

MONK SEALS

The Hawaiian Monk Seal is a protected mammal under Hawaii State Law. You will often see them on the beaches around Paniolo Hale. A sleeping seal can look like a large rock. **DO NOT APPROACH THEM.** They will bite. Hawaii law requires that we maintain a distance of 50 feet for their safety and yours.

AXIS DEER

Molokai is overpopulated by the Axis Deer. You will see large groups in the wild and on our campus. **DO NOT FEED THEM.** PLEASE be especially watchful for deer when you are driving, day or night, as deer will jump out suddenly and have caused many car accidents.

NO CROSSBOWS, BOWS AND ARROWS, OR GUNS ARE ALLOWED AT PANIOLO HALE.

RESPECT THE OCEAN

While the ocean is beautiful and fun, it can also be very dangerous due to large waves and the undertow. Winter surf is especially dangerous. Sadly, even experienced Molokai swimmers and surfers have died on the beaches surrounding Paniolo Hale. **PLEASE BE CAREFUL.**

EMERGENCIES

CALL 911 FOR MEDICAL EMERGENCIES AND FIRE

TSUNAMI OR NUCLEAR ATTACK SIRENS/Monthly Test

On the first business day of every month 11:45 AM, the State of Hawaii Emergency Management Agency tests the Emergency Alert System for:

1. Tsunami / Attention Alert Signal — a steady, minute-long beep — informs residents to turn on a radio or television for information and instruction for an impending emergency, and if in a coastal area, to evacuate to higher grounds.
2. The Nuclear Attack Warning Signal — a wailing, minute-long beep — will follow the attention alert signal, and direct residents to seek immediate shelter, and to remain sheltered until an all-clear message is broadcast over radio or television.

If you hear these sirens, and it is **NOT** the first business day of the month, turn on the TV or radio immediately for emergency information.
